Katsushika Hokusai

Katsushika Hokusai was born in Japan October 1760 and died 10th May 1849. He changed his name professionally many times throughout his life as he learned how to print starting with wood blocks at the age of 15.



Key Skills

- Develop fine motor skills through cutting, pressing, and stamping actions.

Key Knowledge

What is Printing?

- Printing is creating a picture or pattern by pressing a surface onto another material.
- Prints can be made with different objects and materials, such as sponges, leaves, or carved shapes.

Basic Tools and Materials

- Paint, ink, rollers, brushes, sponges, found objects (e.g., leaves, potatoes).
- Paper and fabric as surfaces for printing.
