Covenant- a formal agreement between two parties, indicating a relationship between them e.g God and his people, a married couple.

Mitzvot- the Hebrew word for 'commandment', a rule.

Ten Commandments- the ten mitzvot that are the basis of rules for living for Jewish people, given to Moses by God on Mount Sinai as a sign of his covenant promise.

Torah- 'the Law' or 'teachings', but also the name of the Holy book for Jews.

Bar Mitzvah- the rite of passage marking commitment to the Jewish (synagogue) community.

Promised Land- the land of Israel, that God promised would be the home for Abraham and all his descendants.

Foot festival- yearly festivals that Jewish people (in the past) were obliged to travel to Jerusalem for.

Pesach (Passover)- a Jewish Springtime festival, one of the three foot festivals which commemorates the Exodus, God rescuing the Israelites from slavery in Egypt.

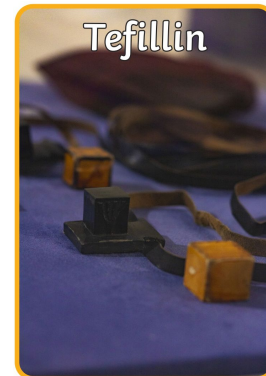
Seder- part of the celebration of Pesach, which involves a meal. The items on a seder plate all symbolise different parts of the story.

Sukkot- a Jewish harvest festival (also a foot festival), commemorating how God provided manna and quail for the people on their journey through the desert to the promised land.

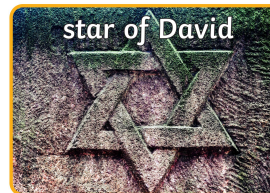
Sukkah- a temporary shelter made for the 8-day festival of Sukkot, commemorating the 'tabernacles' (dwellings) set up by the Israelites each night of their journey.
