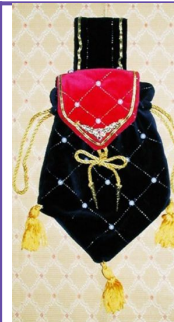
Project:

In this project the children will be learning about what Tudor's clothing was like, and how rich tudor clothing differed from poor tudor clothing. The project is to create a Tudor money pouch for a rich tudor. Within this project, children research what design features may need to be included within this, for example embroidery and tassels, so that they can replicate this on their product.
