Key Concepts:

- **Incarnation:** The belief that Jesus is God in human form ("in flesh").
- **Salvation:** The belief that Jesus' death and resurrection make it possible for humans to be saved from sin.

New knowledge:

Christian Art has been used for over 2,000 years to:

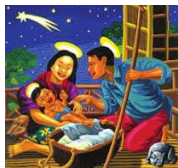
- Express love for God.
- Communicate beliefs about Jesus' life, death, and resurrection.
- Help Christians worship.

Key Beliefs Shown in Art

- Jesus as God who became human (Incarnation).
- Jesus as the Saviour who forgave and helped others (Salvation).
- Showing Jesus as someone who healed, forgave, loved, protected and provided.

Symbols in Christian Art:

- **The Cross:** Represents Jesus' death and resurrection.
- **The Nativity:** Shows Jesus' birth as both human and divine.
