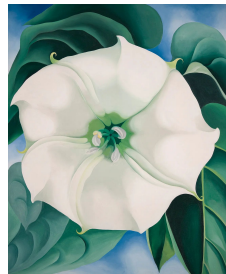
Key Information

Who was Georgia O'Keeffe?

- Georgia O'Keeffe (1887-1986) was an American artist known for her **large-scale flower paintings**, desert landscapes, and abstract compositions.
- She is often called the "Mother of American Modernism."
- O'Keeffe used **bold colors** and **zoomed-in** perspectives to create striking artwork.
- She was inspired by **nature**, especially flowers, bones, and landscapes.

Why is her work important?

- She changed the way people thought about flowers in art.
- She used color and composition in new and exciting ways.
- Her work inspired many artists and is still famous today.



Key Questions to Think About

- What makes Georgia O'Keeffe's flowers look different from real flowers?
- Why did O'Keeffe make her flowers so big?
- How does she use color to show emotions?
- What happens when you blend two colors together?
- How can you use shading to make your artwork look more realistic?

Key Features of Her Artwork

Large-scale – Her flowers look bigger than real life!

Close-up view – She zoomed in so we can see all the tiny details.

Bright & bold colors – She used warm and cool colors to create mood.

Soft shading & blending – She made smooth color transitions for a realistic effect.

Inspired by nature – She painted flowers, skulls, and landscapes.
