Key learning:

- **Urban** – Urban settlements are towns and cities with a high population. E.g. London, Manchester, Birmingham
- **Rural** - found in the countryside, surrounded by open land. Most of the land in the UK is rural. E.g. Lake District, Scottish Highlands, Cornwall.
- In the UK, around 80% of the population live in urban areas and 20% in rural areas.



- **Human feature** – features of our world that have been made by humans. E.g. houses, roads, bridges.
- **Physical feature** - features of our world that have been created by nature. E.g. mountains, rivers, beaches.
