Key Learning
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> People tell stories to teach lessons, share beliefs, and pass on traditions. Stories can help us understand right and wrong. Stories can be part of religious teachings and help believers learn more about their faith. Stories help people learn how to be kind, fair, and brave. Religious stories help believers understand more about God and how to live a good life. Stories are shared in families, places of worship, and schools.

Key Vocabulary
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Story – A tale that is told or written. Belief – Something people think is true. Religion – A set of beliefs about God or gods. God – A special being in many religions. Message – Something important a story is trying to teach us. Parable – A special story that teaches a lesson (used by Jesus). Tradition – Something people do again and again over time.
