## Headteacher's Message

It has been a real pleasure to welcome back our staff, children and families over the past few days. The term has got off to a strong and positive start, with children arriving eager to enjoy time together in their new year groups and get started with their new topics. There's already a real sense of focus and enthusiasm around the school.

I'm hopeful that we can also make a strong start when it comes to attendance. Each academic year provides a fresh start and by working together from day one, we can give every child the best possible chance to thrive. Getting children into school on time, every day really does make a significant difference to their long-term confidence and success.

We understand that returning to routine after the holidays can be a big adjustment for some families. They guide how we build relationships, structure learning and respond to the individual needs of every child. We are continuing to work closely with Nurture UK to ensure our approach is both inclusive and impactful.



Another exciting focus this year is on enriching our curriculum by making the most of our outdoor spaces. As part of our INSET training, staff took part in Forest School training in Woody Oaks, led by Mrs. Bailey and Miss Bessant. We got our hands dirty (quite literally) and experienced the joy of learning in nature. It reminded us how powerful outdoor learning can be in helping children feel calm, grounded and connected as well as boosting both their emotional and academic growth. We're looking forward to further developing this provision.



Finally, we're excited to welcome our new Reception children on Monday. We hope they're feeling excited - our staff certainly are! Classrooms are ready and waiting to be filled with the buzz of busy hands and curious minds and we can't wait to get started.

### Staff News

Mrs. Bourne returned from maternity leave at the end of the summer term and will now work Monday-Thursday.



There are also some congratulations in order. During the Summer Holidays Miss Pollard got married and will now be known as Mrs. Bulford-Davies. Our newest little team members also arrived over the break as Miss Louder welcomed baby Bonnie and Miss Pott welcomed baby Otilie - Mothers and babies are all doing well!

### Values

A reminder of our Walton Oak Way of Being Our Best. These are the values that we strive to live by at Walton Oak to ensure that our school community feel safe and happy. Please discuss them with your children to support them with understanding what they mean and how they can ensure they demonstrate these important values. We will continue to teach children about them in school too.



### Naming uniform

Please remember to name your children's uniform and accessories – especially jumpers, cardigans, ties, coats and water bottles. You can buy really reasonably priced, personalised stamps and labels but a handwritten name with a dark coloured biro will also do the trick! Named items will almost always be returned at some point, whereas unnamed items tend to disappear.

### Breaktime Snacks

We kindly ask for your support in ensuring that children bring healthy snacks to school for breaktimes. A healthy snack could include fruit, vegetables, cereal bars (no nuts), wholegrain crackers or a low-sugar yoghurt tube. These types of food provide steady energy, support concentration and help children stay focused throughout the day. In contrast, snacks that are high in sugar can lead to energy spikes followed by crashes, making it harder for children to concentrate and engage with their learning. Encouraging nutritious choices at breaktime not only supports your child's wellbeing but also helps create a positive learning environment for all.

### Walking home from school unaccompanied by an adult – Years 5 and 6

A letter went home yesterday about children in years 5 and 6 being allowed to walk home unaccompanied by an adult. This is based on their parents/carers feeling comfortable that their child is ready for this level of independence and giving their consent. It is certainly not an expectation for all children and parents/carers are still



very welcome to drop and collect from the classroom doors. Children in these year groups will not be allowed to collect younger siblings from years 4 and below. If children in years 5 and 6 attend an enrichment club they can walk home unaccompanied by an adult in Autumn 1 and again from Spring 2. During the winter months (October half term-February half term) when it becomes dark early, we ask that parents/carers arrange collection.

### PE Uniform

A reminder that children should be wearing the correct school PE uniform to school on their PE days. This is outlined on our website [here](#). Please note that on colder days the alternative to purple shorts is black joggers and a plain black fleece or sweatshirt. Our uniform is a way of unifying our children so they feel a sense of belonging. Please let us know if you need support financially or otherwise with helping your child to meet these expectations.

### School Shoes

As above, the expectations for school shoes are on our website [here](#). In summary, they should be black and shoes not trainers. Some shops sell trainer-like shoes as part of their Back-to-School collection. If children wear trainer-like shoes they should not have bright sports logos on them. If you need support with obtaining the correct school shoes please let us know.

### Meet the Teacher

Our Annual 'Meet the Teacher' opportunity for parents of children in years 1-6 will take place on Wednesday 17<sup>th</sup> September. A letter was sent to all parents this afternoon. This is an opportunity for parents to visit their children's teachers, find out about the curriculum for the year as well as some key information about reading and homework approaches and expectations. There are two sessions at 3.30pm and 6pm. Parents only need to attend one session, however if you have more than one child you may choose to split your time or attend a different session for each time slot. There is no need to book – the letter explains where to go on arrival at school.

### Stay, Play and Learn Sessions for EYFS and KS1 – Save the Date

We invite you to come and join in some phonics learning with your child in their classroom and get involved in their play and learning. This will be followed by a brief information session to help you support your child at home with their phonics. Booking links will be shared next week.

### Attendance & Fixed Penalty Notices

### Penalty Notice and Fines

Changes effective 19/08/24

#### 1 FIRST OFFENCE

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for term time leave or irregular attendance the amount will be:  
**£160 per parent, per child if paid within 28 days.**  
**Reduced to £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days**



#### 2 SECOND OFFENCE

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for term time leave or irregular attendance the amount will be:  
**£160 per parent, per child if paid within 28 days.**  
**No reduced rate will be offered**

#### 3 THIRD OFFENCE AND ANY OTHER OFFENCES (WITHIN 3 YEARS)

The third time an offence is committed for term time leave or irregular attendance, a penalty notice will not be issued and the case will be presented straight to the Magistrates Court. Magistrates fines can be up to £2500 per parent, per child. Cases found guilty in Magistrates Court can show on a parent's future DBS certificate, due to failure to safeguard a child's education.

**10 SESSIONS (5 DAYS) OF UNAUTHORISED ABSENCE IN A 10-WEEK PERIOD** Penalty Notice Fines will be considered when there has been 10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10-week period.

Just to remind parents/carers that if they take their children out of school without authority for 5 or more days (which do not have to be consecutive), then the following will apply:

1. If you have not incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children in a rolling 3 year period since 19 August 2024, then the penalty notice will be charged at the rate of £160.00, **per parent/carer per child**, if paid within 28 days. This will be reduced to £80.00 if paid within 21 days of receipt of the notice. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.

2. If you have incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children since 19 August 2024, the rolling 3 year period will be activated from the date of the first penalty notice and the second penalty notice will be charged at the flat rate of £160.00, per parent/carer per child, if paid within 28 days. There will be no reduction for payment within 21 days. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.

3. If you have incurred 2 penalty notices relating to this child/children in the rolling 3 year period since the first penalty notice was issued, then you will NOT receive a third penalty notice – Surrey County Council will have no option but to consider a prosecution, per parent/carer per child, in the Magistrates Court under s 444 Education Act 1996.

Surrey County Council is not responsible for authorising

pupil absence and therefore cannot withdraw any Penalty Notice requests without the written permission of the Headteacher.

Requests for exceptional leave need to be submitted via the form on our website, at least 2 weeks before the date being requested. There are some requests which will always be authorised such as religious days, weddings and funerals. All other exceptional leave will or will not be authorised on a case by case basis. A child's attendance and previous requests for leave will always be considered when making a decision.

#### Privacy Notice for Pupils, Parents and Carers

Under data protection law, individuals have a right to be informed about how the school uses any personal data that we hold about them. We comply with this right by providing 'privacy notices' (sometimes called 'fair processing notices') to individuals where we are processing their personal data. Our Lumen Learning Trust privacy notice for pupils, parents and carers explains how we collect, store and use pupil & parent/carer personal data. #### Your child's profile name within Google Classroom

Your child will automatically be provided with their own personalised profile to enable them to access Google Classroom as part of their educational experience at our school. This is a fantastic online tool that allows a virtual learning environment to connect teachers and classmates from any location. Additionally, both in certain and uncertain times it ensures that we can provide a safe, secure and reliable way to continuously deliver education. You can read more about our remote learning offer, how and why we use Google Classroom and the security of your child's data by visiting our school website and navigating to Curriculum > Online Learning.

Each child has a unique profile which represents them in the online classroom, this is comprised of a name tag. Only the individuals in the virtual class can view this profile and all members of a Classroom are bound by the



Lumen Family Acceptable Use of ICT Agreement and E-Safety Rules. For clarity purposes their name tag is comprised of their forename and surname. However, if you would like your child's profile name to show only the first initial of their forename and full surname please do contact our school office who can action this for you.

Sharing data and information with NHS Surrey to support children to access local health and wellbeing services  
Surrey Children's Community Health Provider, Children and Family Health Surrey request regular information from us about our children to support planning and delivery of school-based health screening at different points of a child's life. Information provided to them by the school is Name, Gender, Address and DOB. Assurances have been received from the Service that this request is in accordance with Government guidelines and adheres to the required Data Protection standards. #### Holiday Activities and Food Programme HAF vouchers

Surrey County Council have partnered with HolidayActivities to support the delivery of the Holiday Activities and Food programme (HAF), a scheme which offers free school holiday club places to children entitled to Free School Meals (FSM). This means that we automatically distribute HAF vouchers to all our eligible families via the free HolidayActivities platform without families having to request the vouchers. Vouchers will be sent via email to the same parent who currently receives the holiday time FSM vouchers. #### Reading

Reading Rewards at Walton Oak – A Guide for Parents

We're pleased to remind you of how our Reading Rewards system works, and how you can help support your child's reading journey at home.



Each week, we count the number of reads recorded in your child's reading record. These can include:

- Reading at home with a parent or carer
- An adult reading to your child



- Reading with an adult in school

Please note that we count a maximum of 10 reads per week. If you read more than that—fantastic!—but only 10 will go towards the weekly total.

As children build up their reads, they will receive rewards to celebrate their achievements:

- 20 reads – Sticker
- 50 reads – Bookmark
- 100 reads – Certificate (children will receive this from a member of the Senior Leadership Team)
- 150 reads – Pencil
- 200 reads – Badge
- 300 reads – Medal
- 400 reads – Book voucher

Once children reach 100 reads and beyond, their name will be added to our “reading wire” display in school and they’ll receive a special mention in our Friday celebration assembly.

Thank you for continuing to support reading at home—it makes a huge difference to your child’s progress and enjoyment of learning.

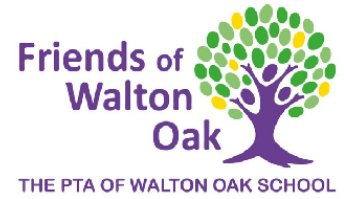
