**400 reads** – Book voucher

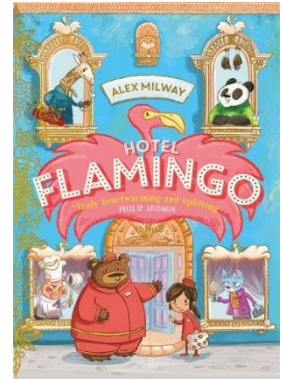


Once children reach 100 reads and beyond, their name will be added to our "reading wire" display in school and they'll receive a special mention in our Friday celebration assembly.

She thoroughly enjoyed meeting the hilarious new characters who pass through the hotel and loved making up voices for them based on their descriptions! She would recommend this book to 5-9 year olds who enjoy a funny story. Hotel Flamingo is a fantastically imaginative, illustrated chapter book - perfect for fans of Alex T. Smith's 'Claude' books and Harriet Muncaster's 'Isadora Moon' series.



**What is Comprehension?**  
Comprehension is the ability to understand and grasp the meaning of something, whether it's written text, spoken language, or a situation. It involves extracting meaning, making connections, and understanding the overall message, rather than just processing individual words. Effective comprehension relies on skills like vocabulary, background knowledge, and reasoning.

Tips for developing comprehension whilst reading with your child

- **Discuss characters and feelings** – "How do you think they felt when that happened?"
- **Summarise together** - At the end, ask your child to tell you what the story was about and to retell it in their own words.
- **Make connections** - Link the book to their own life or another story: "This reminds me of when... What does it remind you of?"

Year 5 Visit to the Magna Carta Memorial

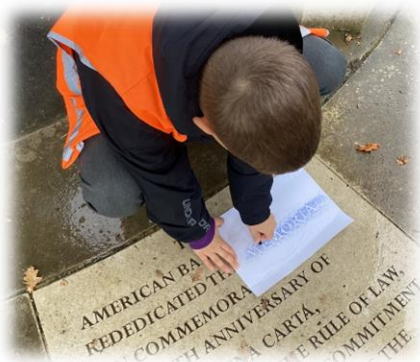
As part of their history learning this half term, Year 5 have been studying the *Magna Carta* and its importance in shaping laws and democracy. To deepen their understanding, the children visited the Magna Carta Memorial at Runnymede.



In preparation for the trip, the children wrote their own audio guides during Writing lessons, using their knowledge of the Magna Carta to inform and engage listeners. While at the memorial, they were able to listen to their own recordings, bringing their writing and history learning together in a truly meaningful way.

They were fascinated to stand in the very place where King John sealed the Magna Carta in 1215 and enjoyed discussing how its ideas still influence our lives today. The trip was a wonderful way to connect classroom learning with real-world history.

Year 6 Residential to Bristol

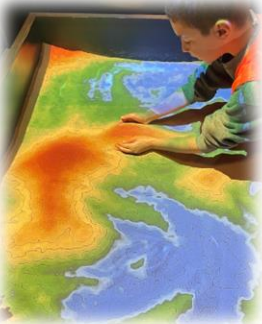

### Year 4 visit from the Youth Engagement Officer

Today, Year 4 had a visit from the Youth Engagement Officer. We talked about the different people who help us, like family, paramedics, police officers, teachers, firefighters, and coastguards.

He showed us what a typical day looks like for him by putting his day in order. He also talked us through his uniform and the different pieces of equipment he carries — including his earpiece, torch, gloves, radio, phone, handcuffs, seatbelt cutter, camera, baton, and ticket printer. He even showed us things used in emergencies, like pepper spray and a taser, but said the most important tool of all is his voice.

We asked lots of great questions, such as:

- Which piece of equipment do you use the most?
- Why did you want to be a police officer?
- Have you ever had to arrest someone?
- What is it like being a police officer?
- How do tasers make your muscles go stiff?

It was a really interesting visit, and we learned a lot about how police officers help to keep everyone safe.


