COMPUTING

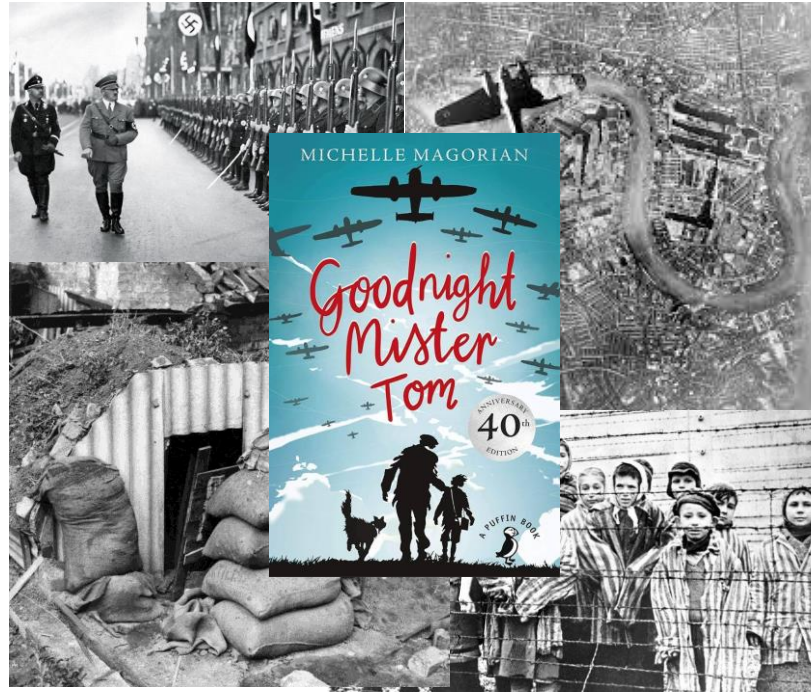
Computing systems and networks

- Evaluate and edit by proposing changes to vocabulary, grammar and punctuation
- Proof-read for spelling and punctuation errors
- Perform own compositions, using appropriate intonation, volume, movement so that meaning is clear



MATHS

Fractions

- Reasoning practise – the four operations
- Add, subtract, multiple and divide fractions including using whole numbers and mixed numbers
