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## Headteacher's Message



Thank you to all who attended our highly-anticipated Parent Learning Conference on Wednesday evening, especially our community partners who gave up their time to come along and run an information stand. Special thanks goes to Tim and Anthony from Eduthing; Carol Robins from Homestart; Lorraine from Green spaces, in partnership with Walton Charities; Pam from Walton Charities and Tina and Nicky from our school catering team. We are so proud of this event, in providing parents with a wealth of information about how to support their children at home both academically and with their health and wellbeing. I also feel really proud of our staff team, especially our teachers and pastoral team in giving their time to running stalls and workshops into the evening. We've had some wonderful feedback so far and I would urge anyone who attended to let us know what you thought so we can continue to review how best to navigate the support and information we provide to families. If you weren't able to attend but would have liked to, we will survey again the barriers that may have impacted on you being able to come along.

In the Diversity and Equality section below, Miss Stanbrook and Mrs Brace (our PSHE leads) have celebrated the learning that took place during anti-bullying week. Despite the focus of the week being on the important concepts of kindness, respect and speaking up (so as to use our power for good), there have still been some incidents where children have not demonstrated these concepts through their actions – causing emotional or physical harm to others. Time has been spent ensuring these children understand the impact their choices have on others. However, I ask that all parents and carers also spend time reiterating these messages to their children, with particular emphasis on children asking themselves the important questions: **is it respectful? is it safe?** Please remind the children that if ever the answer to either of these questions is 'no' then they must stop and rethink their behaviour to make a better choice. Please also remind your children of the importance of **speaking out** when they see any wrongdoing so the staff can provide support in a timely manner. By doing this, we can ensure Walton Oak remains a peaceful and happy place where everyone can be their best.

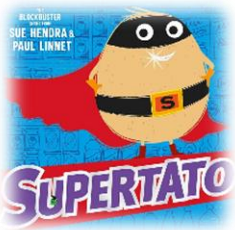

## Pastoral News



### Understanding the Zones of Regulation: Helping Children Name & Navigate Big Feelings

In school we teach the **Zones of Regulation**, which is a framework to help children understand their emotions, build self-regulation skills, and make thoughtful choices.

The Zones of Regulation organise feelings and states of alertness into four simple colour zones:

#### ■ Blue Zone – Low Energy Emotions

Children may feel tired, bored, sad, or sick. In this zone, they may need rest, comfort, or gentle encouragement to re-engage.

#### ■ Green Zone – Calm, Ready-to-Learn Emotions

Children feel focused, calm, and content. This is the ideal zone for learning, problem-solving, and positive social interactions.

#### ■ Yellow Zone – Heightened Emotions

Feelings like frustration, silliness, worry, or excitement fit here. Energy is elevated but still manageable with support and strategies.

#### ■ Red Zone – Big, Intense Emotions

This includes anger, panic, extreme frustration, or feeling out of control. Children may need space, calming tools, and time to reset safely

### Why We Teach It

The Zones help children:

- build emotional vocabulary
- understand that **all feelings are normal**
- recognize their own cues
- use strategies to return to a zone that helps them learn and connect

At school, we practice identifying zones, using coping tools, and reflecting on what helps us feel regulated throughout the day.

### How You Can Support at Home

- Ask questions like, *"What zone are you in right now?"*
- Celebrate your child's awareness: *"Great job noticing you were in the Yellow Zone!"*
- Share your own zones: *"I'm in the Blue Zone—I need a few minutes to rest."*
- Practice calming strategies together, such as deep breathing, stretching, or taking a break in a cozy spot.

## Diversity and Equality

### Include others when working and playing

In Monday's assembly the children found out about Maria Corina Machado from Venezuela who was the 2025 winner of the Nobel Peace Prize. They first learnt what a Nobel Prize was by watching the





following [short video](#). They then learnt about Maria’s story and how she worked peacefully to make her country fairer and protect people’s right. They thought about her bravery in speaking out for fairness and freedom and how she chose peace over conflict, listening to others and including people whose voices are often ignored.

Maria shows us that real strength is about being fair, calm and respectful. The children were asked to think about how we can learn from Maria to make our school a fair, calm and respectful place. They considered what it feels like to be included and what helps someone to feel welcome. The

children were also asked: **what makes a good peacekeeper?**



A peacekeeper is someone who tries to calm situations, include others and make things fair.

**Anti Bullying week 2025– The Power of Good**



Last week, our whole school took part in Anti-Bullying Week, exploring this year’s inspiring theme: “The Power of Good.” We began by celebrating Odd Socks Day, with children and staff proudly wearing their brightest, most colourful socks to show that it’s okay to be different.

On Monday, classes joined a special live BBC lesson, helping the children understand how even small actions can make a big difference to others. Throughout the week, pupils took part in a range of activities to reflect on kindness, respect and celebrating what makes each of us unique.



One highlight was our Circle of Kindness activity, where children shared thoughtful, uplifting words with their peers - helping everyone feel appreciated and valued. Every child also created a personal self-portrait, encouraging them to think about what makes them special and to celebrate the positive qualities they bring to our school community. In KS2, pupils produced some truly impressive writing pieces, each exploring how we can all use our "power for good" in everyday life.

We ended the week by putting this message into action during Children in Need Day, where the whole school came together to show kindness, generosity and community spirit.

It was a wonderful week full of positivity, empathy and celebration—reminding us all that even small acts of goodness can have a big impact.

We now hope children continue to put these ideas into practice in their everyday lives in school and on the playground so Walton Oak can continue to be a place to feel happy and to thrive.
