Miss Langley would recommend 'The Day I Fell into a Fairytale' by Ben Miller. This is a magical and heart warming adventure that will capture the imagination of young readers. In this fun and quirky story, 11-year-old Billy is having an ordinary day when, quite unexpectedly, he tumbles into a fairy tale world! But this isn't the fairy tale world he was expecting - it's all upside down and in desperate need of a hero.

What makes this book so special is how Ben Miller blends traditional fairy tale elements with a modern twist. The characters are funny and relatable, and Billy is a brilliant protagonist - brave, clever, and always ready to find a solution, even when things get strange! Along the way, Billy meets talking animals, an eccentric queen, and some truly peculiar creatures, all while trying to get back home.

Miss Langley would recommend this to children aged 8-12 that love a good adventure with a twist of magic!

Year 4 Trip to Painshill Park



Year 4 demonstrated just how amazing we are at Walton Oak Primary School by showing resilience, determination and curiosity throughout our trip to Painshill Park. Despite the windy, cold and wet weather, the children embraced every challenge with enthusiasm.



During the day, we explored orienteering, using map coordinates to navigate our way around the park. Working in teams, the children successfully located ten hidden flags and answered ten accompanying questions about the park.

We also had the opportunity to work with Ranger Adam, who helped us discover and identify a variety of invertebrates. The children learned that animals need four key things to create a suitable habitat: the right temperature, food, water and shelter.

Helping Your Child Navigate the Excitement and Changes of December and Christmas

As we move through December we know it brings with it a sense of excitement and anticipation, something that's magical for many children! However, it can also present some challenges. The increased sensory input, change in routine, and unpredictability of the festive season can be overwhelming for some children. But there are simple ways to help them manage these changes and make the most of the things on offer.

Preparing for Change in Routine

December often means changes to school days, festive events, and time off. This can be unsettling for children who thrive on routine. To help manage this, try to give your child as much notice as possible about upcoming changes. A visual calendar or timetable can be a helpful tool, allowing them to see what's coming up and when. Keeping a consistent bedtime and morning routine as much as possible will also help to reduce anxiety.

Managing the Excitement

The excitement of Christmas, with its countdowns, decorations, and festive activities, can sometimes feel overwhelming. One way to manage this is to create quiet moments throughout the day. You could set up "calm time" when your child can have some down-time, whether that's through reading, drawing, or simply sitting in a quiet space. Offering opportunities to talk about their feelings can also help them process the excitement in a more manageable way.

Addressing Sensory Needs












Christmas often brings with it a host of new sensory experiences, bright lights, loud noises, and the smell of certain foods or decorations. These can be exciting for some, but sensory overload is a real challenge for others. Try to anticipate situations that might be overwhelming and prepare your child for them. At home, providing a calming space with dim lights or soft music can help your child manage sensory overload.

Talking about Expectations

With all the excitement around Christmas, children can sometimes feel overwhelmed by expectations. Help them understand that Christmas is about enjoying time with loved ones, rather than having a perfect holiday. This can reduce the pressure they might feel to "perform" or behave a certain way in social settings, helping them to stay more relaxed and confident.

Providing Reassurance

Lastly, be there to reassure your child if they feel stressed or overwhelmed. Christmas can be a lot to take in, and the busy season can stir up strong emotions. Regularly check in with your child and let them know it's okay to take a break from the excitement if they need to.
