Headteacher's Message

We've welcomed a few visitors this week. Firstly, on Monday and Tuesday this week we were joined by an Inclusion Lead from Surrey Education Services - Schools Alliance for Excellence (SAfE) to carry out an Inclusion Review. This was led by Miss Langley, our Inclusion Lead. Time was spent in classrooms exploring our learning environments, reviewing staff development and school data and speaking with pupils and staff to gain a clear understanding of how we support all learners.

I also joined discussions to evaluate the oversight that I as headteacher have over provision and how we ensure a shared understanding of our inclusive culture. We talked about how this culture is embedded across every aspect of school life, so that inclusion is not just a policy, but something that is consistently lived and modelled by staff and pupils.

The review highlighted many strong examples of inclusive practice in action, with children supported in ways that meet their individual needs. There was also positive feedback on the nurture and trauma informed approaches used to support pupils to be their best. The visit was a valuable opportunity to reflect on our strengths, while also identifying ways to further develop and refine our work, ensuring our children continue to thrive.

We were also delighted to welcome author Lucy Gray Moreland for a special visit on Monday. We are incredibly lucky to have a published author as part of our parent community. Lucy shared her wonderful books with pupils from EYFS to Year 6 and led engaging workshops filled with creative activities exploring the key themes of her stories. Her visit sparked excitement, inspired budding writers and helped nurture a love of reading across the school. We are very grateful to Lucy for giving her time and inspiring our children.

Yesterday, Year 5 and 6 pupils also took part in important workshops on friendship, peer pressure and online safety. They learned how to recognise unhealthy influence, practise refusal skills, protect their privacy online and seek help when needed. This learning supports pupils in making safe, positive choices as they become more independent and prepare for secondary school.

We are looking forward to Maths Week next week, including Friday's Number Day. Children are encouraged to come dressed as rock stars to celebrate - we can't wait to see their creativity and enthusiasm! We are also excited to welcome parents and carers to our end-of-week showcase (see details below). It is always a pleasure to share the children's learning and achievements with you.

We will soon be welcoming more parents into school through our upcoming Stay, Play and Learn sessions. These are a great opportunity to spend time in the classroom and see learning in action. Please remember to sign up if you are able to attend.

Finally, don't forget the FOWO Quiz Night on 6th February. We already have 50 people signed up - including a staff team (no competition, we promise!). General Information

Academic Year 2026-2027 Update

Looking ahead, as I shared previously, Surrey County Council has moved to a two-week October half term starting this year. While we are an academy and not required to follow this, we have chosen to align with the local secondary schools to support families. The Autumn half term in 2026 will run from 19th to 30th October, with the end of the academic year being the 20th July 2027.



From September 2026, the school day will start at 8:45am (instead of 8.50am), with gates and registers closing promptly at this time. We will still open our gates at 8.30am to allow a 15-minute window for children and families to navigate their way around the site. We will accommodate the additional 5 minutes of required learning time within our school timetabling of breaks and assemblies to ensure that children receive their full entitlement. Thank you for your patience whilst we have been considering this change.

Parking and Road Safety

Thank you to those who have changed their habits and are being more thoughtful about where they park when dropping their children at school. This week, the zig zag lines opposite the school have remained clear, providing a clear view for approaching drivers.

Unfortunately, there are still some motorists who drive too fast down Ambleside Avenue and for whatever reason, are leaving it too late to stop safely at the Zebra crossing. On Monday, we will remind children in assembly to always wait until cars have stopped before stepping onto a crossing. Please reiterate this message at home, especially if your children walk to school unaccompanied.

Uniform – ties

A reminder that in KS2, a tie is a central part of our uniform policy. We are noticing more and more children without ties and some polo shirts creeping in. KS1 uniform is a white polo shirt, KS2 uniform is a shirt and tie. Our uniform is an important aspect of helping children feel part of a community. The children have many other ways to express their individual identity but having a smart uniform is part of our collective identity as a school. MMRV

MMRV now protects children against measles, mumps, rubella — and chickenpox

From 1 January 2026, children started to be offered the MMRV vaccine (measles, mumps, rubella and varicella/chickenpox) instead of the MMR vaccine as part of the routine childhood immunisation schedule. This means children will receive protection against four diseases instead of three.

GP practices will contact parents and carers when their child is due for vaccination. Parents are encouraged to book their appointment when they receive their invitation.

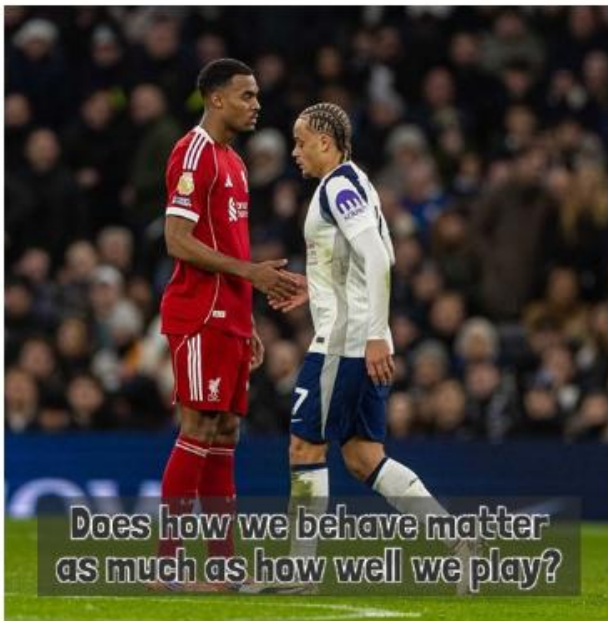
