Headteacher's Message

We have thoroughly enjoyed Maths Week, with a focus on maths in our everyday lives. School has been a real hive of activity and it all culminated today with a Times Tables Rock Stars theme and a family showcase of learning. I am so proud of the children's contributions to a very successful week of maths learning. Throughout the week we have also been flooded with wonderful photos of children using maths in their everyday lives at home. Look out for a special Maths Week newsletter next week to celebrate all the learning that took place. Thank you to Mrs Bourne for organising the week and for the strong collaboration demonstrated between staff, to bring it to life for the children.

Collaboration is an important theme for us at Walton Oak and across our Trust of seven schools. As colleagues, we continually identify ways to share best practice in order to enhance opportunities for both staff and children, as well as looking for ways to collaborate across our wider community. Last week, the LLT headteachers met to carry out some training on this theme. It involved some deep reflection about ourselves and a willingness to share, so we can learn how to bring out the best in each other. We also thought about our barriers to change and how to overcome them. I felt grateful to have such strong support around me and keen to continue seeking ways to work with others.

Today we were visited by our Chair of Trustees, Jo Roberts, who is a Park Run Ambassador, alongside two other Park Run Ambassadors, Claire and Richard. They led an exciting assembly for our children about Junior Park Run, speaking about the benefits of attending a local event. They shared information about our nearest runs at Laleham and Bushy Park and showed a short film before encouraging the children to get on their feet and practise some warm-up exercises. It was great to see that many of our children already take part in a local Park Run and many more were keen to join in. We will be signing up as a school and sharing further information about how to join a local Park Run in our newsletter very soon.



Yesterday, James Orbell, our Chair of Governors, joined me for a monitoring visit where we evaluated our processes for managing behaviour, with a focus on exclusions. He saw how detailed and robust our systems are and commented on how inclusive we are, while doing our utmost to ensure children learn in a safe environment. It is clear that many processes are working well and that areas for development are understood and already underway. I am grateful for this support, which helps provide assurance that we are working in the best interests of our children.



Finally, I would like to say a big well done to our pupil leaders who have been working on an important project linked to our journey towards Nurture UK accreditation. They have thoughtfully developed child-friendly language for the six principles of nurture and considered how to help children, staff and families understand and live by these principles. On Monday, they led a whole-school assembly to introduce the six principles. The children responded very positively. Further information about this can be found below.

Panathlon



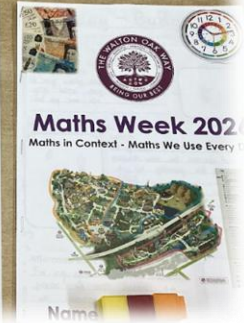

Children's Mental Health Week

Monday marks the start for Children's Mental Health Week with Place2Be and the focus of the work is "This is my place". The key theme is belonging which has been a focus of Walton Oak's school development plan and continues to underpin everything we do. This week the children have been introduced to the themes through their phase assemblies and next week the children will be creating their own art learning based on "This is my place".



We know that our sense of belonging as individuals, in our friendships, in school and in communities plays a vital role in our mental health and wellbeing. Belonging is the feeling of being a valued part of the groups and places that are important to us. It means feeling cared for and comfortable to be ourselves.

The activity they will be completing will encourage children to explore their sense of belonging by creating a personal map, which can include places, groups, or activities or something not physical where they feel they belong.

Over the weekend, talk with your child about the places they might want to include on their map and if they would like to bring in any photos or things to add to their maps they can.
