## Headteacher's Message

Last week we held our Spring Term meeting of the Local Governing Body. These meetings are an important opportunity to reflect on the work of the school and to look ahead at the priorities that will continue to shape our development.



One key area that remains central to our work is our journey towards becoming a fully Nurturing School. Alongside this newsletter you will find a leaflet produced by our Pupil Leadership Team, which explains what nurture means to them and why the Six Principles of Nurture we have introduced are so important. We are proud that our pupils are able to articulate how these principles help to create a school where everyone feels safe, valued and ready to learn.

Another priority for the school is continuing to embed Oracy across the curriculum. We want our



children to develop the confidence and skills to express themselves clearly, explain their thinking and engage in meaningful discussion. By strengthening speaking and listening, we support children to organise their ideas, deepen their reasoning and ultimately become better communicators in both speaking and writing.

We are also continuing to build teacher expertise through collaboration across our trust. By working alongside colleagues from other schools, sharing practice and learning from one another, we ensure that teaching continues to develop and that our pupils benefit from the very best approaches.

One particular ongoing challenge that is often discussed and that we must continue to address transparently with you as parents, is the impact of smartphone use. Today, we sent a letter to parents in Years 4, 5, and 6 as this is typically when the transition to independent mobile use begins. However, we are aware that even our youngest pupils frequently use devices to watch videos or play games.

The issues we face extend far beyond simple "screen time." Children are increasingly exposed to content - both imagery and language - that they are not yet developmentally equipped to process. Furthermore, participation in large social media groups often leads to conflicts that spill into the school day. This pressure to "grow up fast" is impacting children's wellbeing, their academic success and their ability to simply enjoy childhood. We remain committed to supporting our children through these digital challenges and have included further guidance in this newsletter to help us tackle this together.

Finally, an exciting event is taking place tonight as our Year 3 Sleepover gets underway. This is an annual tradition and for many children it will be the first time they have stayed away from home. The evening will be filled with games and activities, followed by a hot chocolate before everyone settles down to camp out on the classroom floors. It is always a wonderful and memorable experience for the children. A huge thank you to the staff who are giving their time to make this special event possible.

Year 6 Football

Against The Hythe, Walton Oak had to dig deep after falling behind, but the team responded brilliantly with some excellent passing and determined play. ### Diversity and Equality



In assembly this week, we spent some time talking about a topic that many children may have seen mentioned on television or heard adults discussing - the conflict involving Iran and the involvement of America.



The discussion was carefully explained in very simple terms, focusing on the idea that when countries disagree it can sometimes lead to conflict, but that many leaders around the world are working hard to try to solve problems peacefully. Our focus was on the importance of peace and the hope that disagreements can be resolved through discussion and cooperation.

We linked this idea to life in school. Just as countries sometimes have disagreements, children can also experience big feelings or worries when things don't go the way they hope. We talked about how, like the leaders trying to resolve conflict peacefully, we can learn to manage our worries and solve problems calmly, using the strategies we practise in school.

The children also watched a short video explaining that events often become news stories because they are unusual or surprising. This helped the children understand that while news can sometimes sound worrying, it often focuses on events that are rare rather than everyday life: <https://www.bbc.co.uk/newsround/13865002>

We explained that learning about what is happening in the world and hearing about different places and cultures helps to broaden our understanding. It encourages curiosity, empathy and respect and supports our children in becoming thoughtful global citizens.
