## Headteacher's Message

Welcome to the summer term. I hope everyone had an enjoyable break. I would also like to extend a particularly warm welcome to parents of our upcoming September 2026 Reception children who may be reading this. While primary school offers were shared yesterday, Surrey County Council has asked schools to delay formal welcomes until next week to ensure all families are contacted by them first. Therefore, please look out for our welcome letter, which will be sent to individual families next Tuesday. In the meantime, we hope you are looking forward to joining us as much as we are to getting to know you and your children over the coming weeks.



The sunshine has made a welcome appearance this week and the blossom on the trees is a lovely sign that warmer days are approaching. It has been great to see our full lunchtime offer return, with the field and Trim Trail back in use. You may have noticed the new fencing and gated entrance around the Trim Trail, which supports a one-way system and reduces free flowing running to make the area even safer. Entering a defined space in this way, much like Woody Oaks, encourages children to recognise that they are moving into an area with a different level of risk. This helps them become more aware of their surroundings, manage risk and make informed decisions about their play. Following a review of our risk assessments, Reception children will continue to use their own climbing stack for now and will join the main Trim Trail later this term after introductory sessions with their teachers.

Thank you to everyone who has ensured children have returned looking smart and in line with our uniform policy. We noticed a decline in ties being worn in Key Stage 2 last term, so it has been very positive to see these return. Our uniform creates a strong sense of unity and, like any team, reminds children of our shared purpose of learning. While there are differing views on ties, this simple symbol helps bring us together and it is important that this expectation is upheld in Key Stage 2. We will of course let you know if the weather becomes too warm for ties, and top buttons may be undone for comfort. If there is a specific diagnosed reason why your child finds wearing a tie particularly difficult, please contact us so we can work together on a supportive plan.



There is a great deal to look forward to this term, so please take time to check the new dates in this newsletter and on the school calendar. Our Year 3 children visited Gurdwara this week as part of their learning about Sikhism and staff were pleased to see how much they enjoyed the experience, particularly the opportunity to share the tasty food on offer. We are proud to offer experiences like this and I was especially impressed by the respect shown towards traditions different from their own, which is central to building an inclusive community.

In assembly this week we explored the Artemis II space mission, considering both its scientific importance and the powerful perspective it offers. The astronauts often described how, when viewed from space, Earth appears as one small bright home for all of humanity. I reminded the children that at Walton Oak we are each other's "Crew". By looking out for one another and applying our nurture principles, we create an environment where every child can thrive and be the very best they can be.

### Do children always need antibiotics for ear infections?

Survey reveals 1 in 3 parents believe children always need antibiotics for ear infections

36% of parents surveyed believe that children always need antibiotics for ear infection according to research conducted by the UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA). The study, led by the UKHSA surveyed over 500 parents whose children had experience ear infection symptoms in the previous year.

Ear infections are very common, particularly in children, and often get better on their own within 3 days although sometimes symptoms can last up to a week. Research shows that as few as 1 in 5 children are likely to require antibiotics to treat an ear infection. The NHS have also published advice on what to do if you think your child has ear infection - [Ear infections - NHS](#)

Catherine Hayes, the UKHSA study lead said "While antibiotics are sometimes necessary for children with ear infections, unnecessary antibiotic use can cause side effects in children and contribute to **antimicrobial resistance**. If your child is prescribed antibiotics, it's important to follow the advice of your GP, nurse or pharmacist."

The survey highlights that more can be done to support parents to understand when an ear infection is serious and what they can do. UKHSA's work will aim to address this by developing resources to support health professionals and patients during consultations.



**Antimicrobial resistance (AMR)** occurs when bacteria, viruses, fungi, and parasites evolve to withstand the medicines designed to kill them. This makes standard treatments ineffective, leading to persistent infections, severe illness, or death. It is a natural evolutionary process accelerated by the misuse and overuse of antibiotics

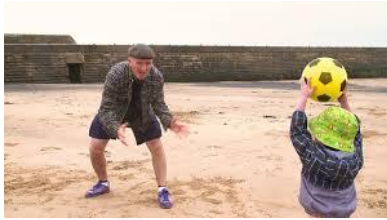

As we have had some sunshine this week, it would be nice to get outside and play some ball games. Follow the link below to see 5 simple ball games to try with your families.

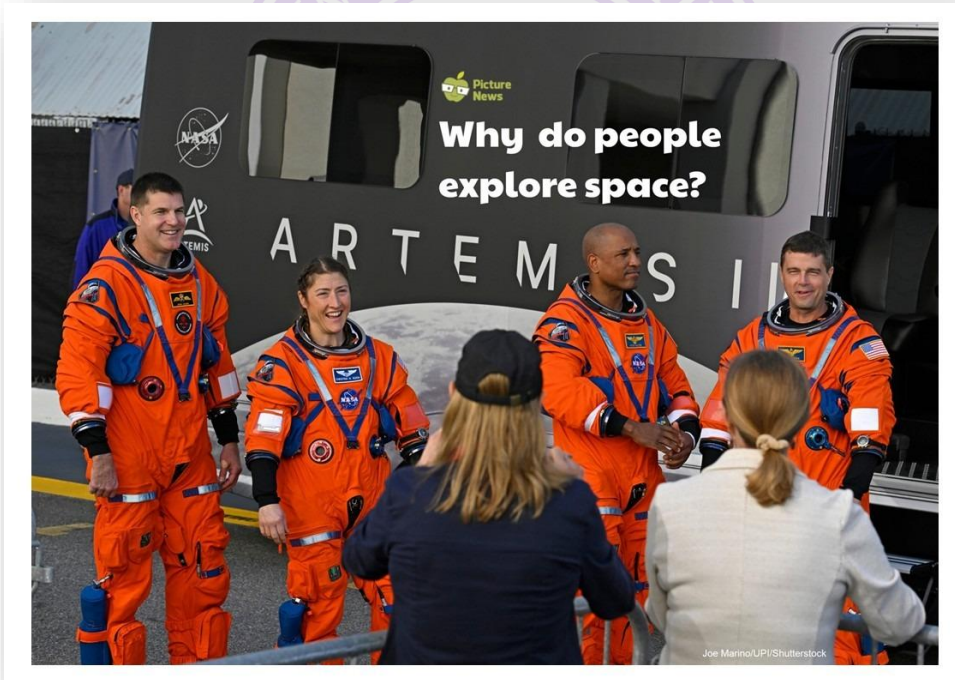

Enrichment Activities

EYFS - Oral Hygiene Talk

As part of our Early Years Curriculum, we've been exploring the importance of oral hygiene this week and what a fantastic learning experience it's been! We were delighted to welcome a visit from the school nurse, who helped us understand just how important it is to keep our teeth clean and healthy.

The children discovered lots of fascinating facts, including:

- Children have 20 teeth, and adults grow a total of 32!
- Brushing twice a day, morning and evening, is essential





- Teeth should be brushed for a full two minutes (timers at the ready!)
- It's best not to rinse after brushing, so the toothpaste can continue protecting our teeth
- Sugary foods should only be enjoyed as an occasional treat, as they can lead to cavities
- Visiting the dentist twice a year helps keep our smiles in top condition

The children thoroughly enjoyed the session and were especially excited to take home their very own toothbrush and toothpaste. They're now all set to put their new knowledge into practice so keep an eye out for lots of bright, healthy smiles!

In Monday's assembly, the children reflected on the recent return of four astronauts Victor Glover, Christina Koch, Reid Wiseman and Jeremy Hansen and what their journey teaches us about life here on Earth.



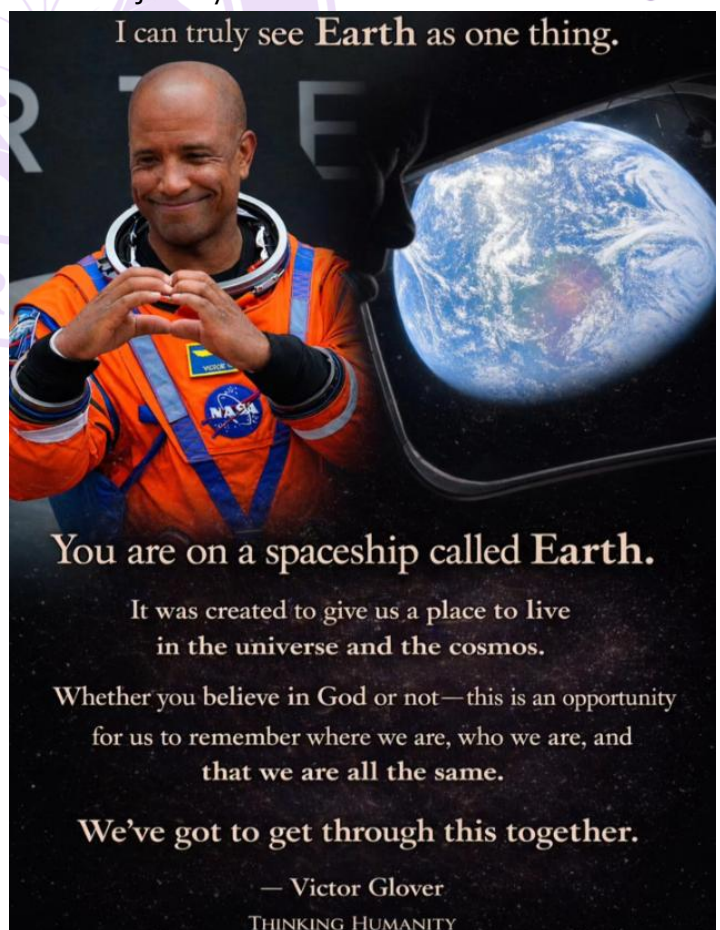
Their mission, part of Artemis II, involved travelling around the Moon and safely returning, marking an important step in future human exploration of space.

Seeing our planet from space as one shared home helped the children think about the importance of kindness, inclusion and working together.

We also recognised the historic significance of the mission, including Victor Glover as the first Black astronaut to travel to the Moon, and Christina Koch as the first woman. The children learned how these achievements show that space exploration, and the future, is for everyone. As Victor Glover has said, "diversity is important for excellence," reminding us that different perspectives make teams stronger.

They explored how courage, teamwork and diversity help people achieve great things, and discussed simple ways they can show these values in school, by helping others, making everyone feel included and treating each other with respect.

The assembly ended with a shared message of "peace and hope," encouraging the children to be kind to one another and to remember that we are all part of the same world and community.
