Headteacher's Message

Our year 6 children enjoyed a visit from the ice cream van today as a treat for being their best during a week of statutory testing. We are so proud of the effort they put into the tests, applying the techniques that they have been taught and staying calm, focused and positive. I am grateful for the care and support that our whole staff have provided year 6 with this over these last few weeks to help them feel supported and ready for their first experience of a formal examination process. It certainly is a whole school effort. Thank you to Caroline Smart and Karina Kajelova who in their Parent Governor role, gave up their time to support too.

We all know that these papers give just a snap shot of each child's overall capabilities. However, they help us to ensure we have done our best to prepare them with the necessary English and maths skills required to support future success at secondary school. In addition, throughout their time at Walton Oak, we ensure that pupils are given the right opportunities to develop and celebrate their creativity, understanding of the world around them, sporting abilities and character - all of which are equally important for future success. We look forward to shifting our focus back onto the wider curriculum as they embark on their last few weeks of Primary school.



Today as part of our continued efforts to ensure that children have wide ranging cultural experiences, our year 2 children visited the North West Surrey Synagogue in Weybridge. They had a tour of the building and learnt about Jewish traditions and practices, reinforcing their learning from the Spring term. It is wonderful to have so much support from our parent community in ensuring that our children attend these important learning opportunities with curiosity and positivity.

- Refunds – new process for Tax Free Childcare Refunds & childcare Voucher Refunds
