Staying safe around water this summer



As the weather warms up, more young people are spending time outdoors and around open water. Surrey Fire and Rescue Service is reminding families to stay safe around water this summer.

We ask parents and carers to have an open conversation at home about staying safe near rivers, lakes, reservoirs and quarries. While these places may look calm and inviting, they can be extremely dangerous. Cold water shock, hidden hazards, sudden drops and unstable ground can all pose serious risks, even for strong swimmers.

Figures show that between 2019 and 2024, 1,602 people in the UK lost their lives in accidental drowning incidents. 56% (901) of these occurred in inland waters such as rivers, lakes and reservoirs. Alarmingly, around half of those who drown had no intention of entering the water, with slips, trips and falls identified as a leading cause. We are also seeing an increase in risk-taking behaviour, including swimming in unsupervised areas, jumping into unknown water and accessing restricted locations. These situations can escalate quickly and may be difficult for emergency services to reach.

It's important that young people know what to do if they find themselves in trouble in the water. Teach your child to **Float to Live**: tilt their head back with ears submerged, relax and try to control their breathing, use their hands and legs to stay afloat, and once the effects of cold water shock have passed, call for help or swim to safety if able.

Please also remind your child that if they ever see someone in trouble in the water, they should call 999 immediately and never attempt a rescue themselves.

Please encourage your child to stay out of unsafe water, follow warning signs and look out for their friends. By talking about the risks and how to respond, we can help keep young people safe around water this summer.

Update to SEND communication arrangements from June 2026

From 1 June 2026, the SEND Service has introduced a new way of working designed to make communication clearer, more consistent and more reliable for schools, education settings, families, and professionals.

Each child or young person will continue to have a named EHCP Coordination Officer (ECO), who will remain the key point of relationship and oversight. However, instead of relying on individual email inboxes, all enquiries will be received and managed through dedicated area SEND inboxes.

We recognise that changes to familiar ways of working can feel unsettling, particularly for families who value having a direct and personal contact. During the early stages of implementation, there may be some uncertainty or adjustment, and we appreciate the patience and understanding of schools, families, and partners as everyone becomes used to the new approach.

This change has been carefully considered in response to feedback from families, schools and settings, which highlighted that communication can sometimes be delayed when it depends on an individual's availability. The new shared inbox model introduces a more joined-up, team-based approach, enabling EHCP Coordination Officers, EHCP Coordination Managers and Area SEND Managers to view, track and respond to messages more efficiently.

Once fully embedded, we expect this approach to:

- Support more timely and reliable responses
- Reduce the risk of missed or delayed communication
- Provide greater consistency for children and young people with SEND and their families
- Strengthen collaboration across teams



We ask education settings to support this transition by sharing this update with families and carers, helping them understand what is changing and what they can expect from June 2026.

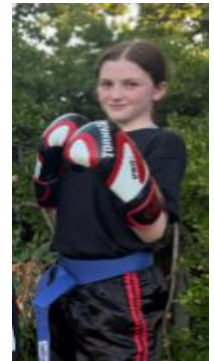
