## Headteacher's Message

Thank you to all the families who donated bottles and sweets today for our Summer Fair non-uniform day. The children enjoyed coming to school in their own clothes. If you haven't yet had a chance to contribute, donations are still very welcome ahead of the Summer Fair tomorrow!



As we approach what looks set to be a sunny weekend, many families may be planning visits to beauty spots near open water. On Monday, Miss Langley led an assembly on water safety, helping children understand how to stay safe around open water and what to do if they find themselves or others in difficulty. ### Staff News: A Warm Welcome

We have some wonderful new additions to our team:

Miss Hughes will begin her teaching career with us in July, joining our LLT induction programme. Mr Roche joins us as an experienced class teacher and subject leader. Mrs. Algar will be joining us three days a week, sharing a class with Miss Pott (who returns from maternity leave). Miss Pott will also resume her role as a Senior Leader in the school.

We are very much looking forward to welcoming all of our new staff members for 'Move-Up Morning' in the very near future!

### Special News

We are thrilled to be able to share the very special news that Miss Sandell and her Fiancé are expecting their first baby, due in December. You will no doubt join us in congratulating them. During the autumn, Miss Sandell will be non-class based. She will however, continue to Phase Lead KS1 and prepare for a thorough handover of Phase and Phonics Leadership later in the term.

### Walking to and from school in September

From September, only Year 6 children will be permitted to walk to and from school unaccompanied. This will require parental consent, which will be sought and reviewed at the end of Year 5 in preparation for the autumn term.

As a result, only Year 6 children who walk independently will be allowed to bring a mobile phone to school. Phones must be handed in immediately on arrival and collected at the end of the day. They must not remain with children during the school day.

This decision reflects our experience that many Year 5 children are not yet ready for this level of independence. We also value the opportunity for parents and carers to greet their children at the end of the school day, which supports our nurturing approach. In Year 6, our focus shifts towards preparing children for secondary school and we will support independent travel where children demonstrate responsibility and follow the Walton Oak Way.

Children in all other year groups, including younger siblings, must continue to be accompanied to and collected from their classrooms by a parent or carer, unless they attend Breakfast or After School Club.

While staff are present at the school gates each morning and afternoon to welcome families, responsibility for supervising children before they enter the school building remains with parents and carers. Thank you for your understanding and support.

### Pastoral News

#### Supporting your child with change

As we approach the time of year when change and transition is thought about, children can have some very mixed feelings. You can help your child manage these feelings by:

- **Talking it through (and listen)**  
Encouraging your child to share how they are feeling and that it is completely normal to feel that way. Try asking open-ended questions like "What are you most looking forward to next year?" or "Is there anything you're feeling a bit worried about?"
- **Focus on the positives**  
If we as adults talk about the upcoming changes with optimism, they are more likely to view them as an adventure rather than something to worry about. Remind them of previous times they faced something new and handled it successfully.
- **Practice strategies**  
Work on strategies together that can help you feel calm, this might be deep breathing, having a drink, colouring or anything else that works for them
- **Keep evenings calm**  
The final few weeks of term can be exhausting with sports days, plays, and assemblies. Tired children find it harder to regulate their emotions. Prioritise early bedtimes and quiet evenings at home to give them space to recharge.
