## Headteacher's Message

I have been so pleased with how well the children have handled the warmer weather over the last few days. They've done a great job of looking after themselves, staying hydrated, finding the shade and showing real maturity by taking quiet moments to reset whenever they felt overwhelmed. With temperatures remaining high next week, please ensure your child has sun cream applied before school and please provide with a sun hat and a named, refillable water bottle - we will make sure they have plenty of opportunities to refill them.

To help everyone stay cool, school ties may be removed until further notice. Please also leave jumpers and cardigans at home, as some children struggle to recognise when they are overheating and it is best to remove the option for their own wellbeing.

The sunshine is perfectly timed for Sports Day, though its looking to reach exceptionally high temperatures. We already have our plans in place and are keeping an eye on the weather in order to make any necessary adjustments on the day to keep everyone safe and comfortable in the heat. ### Important Date for Your Diary: Additional October INSET Day

### Partnership for Inclusion of Neurodiversity in Schools (PINS)

We are delighted to share that Walton Oak will be taking part in the Partnership for Inclusion of Neurodiversity in Schools (PINS) project next year. The PINS programme is funded by NHS England and the Department for Education and works in partnership with schools, health services, and parent-carer organisations. The project supports schools in developing inclusive practices, building staff confidence, and providing early support for neurodiverse children. Schools across Surrey that have already participated have reported positive outcomes, including greater consistency in supporting children, stronger partnerships with families and a shared understanding of inclusion across the school community. We are excited to be part of this initiative and look forward to sharing updates with you throughout the year as we work together to further strengthen our inclusive approach and support all children to thrive.

### Important Allergy Reminder – No Nuts & Sesame Seeds

Many of our families are already aware that we are a nut free setting. We would also like to make you aware that we currently have a number of children with a serious sesame allergy.

Sesame can sometimes be found in foods that may not seem obvious, including breadsticks, crackers, cereal bars, bagels, breads, and other baked snacks. We kindly ask that you take a moment to check ingredient labels carefully when preparing your child's lunch.

Please avoid sending foods containing nuts and sesame into the setting and remind your child not to share food with their friends.

We greatly appreciate your support in helping us keep all children safe and included. Thank you for working with us to create a safe environment for everyone.

### Exciting News: A Fresh New Menu (and a New Way to Order) is Coming This September!

We are delighted to announce that Lumen Learning Trust has appointed a fantastic new school caterer, Dolce Ltd, starting on 1st September. Dolce is a wonderful, family-run company that specialises in education catering, focusing on providing freshly prepared, healthy meals with plenty of delicious choices.

Along with new menus, Dolce are also upgrading how school meals are ordered and paid for by introducing SchoolGrid. This convenient catering parent portal will allow you to easily pre-order meals, pay securely by card, and directly input vital allergen information for your child. **You do not need to do anything at the moment.** The email address for your child's priority 1 contact will shortly be shared with SchoolGrid. Once the system is fully ready to launch, you will receive an email from SchoolGrid containing an activation link and full details of next steps that must be completed before school starts in September. ### Support for families during the summer school holidays

The UK Government funded Crisis and Resilience Fund is available to those on low incomes who face sudden financial pressures. It is currently in the process of being set up by Surrey County Council and partners across Surrey to determine how best to allocate this limited funding, which is lower than previous Household Support Fund funding, so that both short-term and longer-term initiatives reach those who need support the most. We are also awaiting further details on the UK Government's recently announced Great British Summer Savings scheme, which is expected to include free bus travel for children and targeted food tariff reductions. This great initiative will help families and children travel for less this summer. We are working with our bus operators and will provide more updates soon. Until then, remember young people aged 20 and under can also apply for a LINK card to get 50% off adult bus fares in Surrey.

The aim of this resource is to offer insight into practice across different types of schools and perspectives, to strengthen alignment with guidance, and promote a consistent, collaborative approach to meeting needs.

We are particularly keen to hear from people with experience of working with children and young people, especially those with additional needs, disabilities, or who have experienced adversity or complex life circumstances. Volunteers should be reliable, patient, and empathetic.



Training, ongoing support, and expenses are provided. Volunteers are asked to commit to monthly visits for a minimum of two years.

### Pastoral News

#### Supporting your child when worries happen



It is completely normal for children to feel worried from time to time. Whether this is about experiencing something new, a change in routine or a disagreement with friends, worry is a natural human emotion. Here are some top tips to support your child with worries.

#### 1. Validate First, Fix Later

When our child is upset, our instinct is to say, "Don't worry, you'll be fine!" While well-meaning, this can accidentally make them feel like their feelings are wrong. Try validating them first: "It makes total sense that you're nervous about going to the new club, it is something you haven't done before." This can help them start to calm down making it much easier to talk about solutions.

#### 2. Look at the "Circle of Control"

Worries sometimes focus on the things we can't change. Help your child break down a problem by asking what they *can* actually action:

- Outside their control: What other children do, what the weather is like, or what questions are on the test.
- Inside their control: Asking an adult for help, choosing to be kind, or packing their school bag the night before.

#### 3. Create a daily "Worry Time"

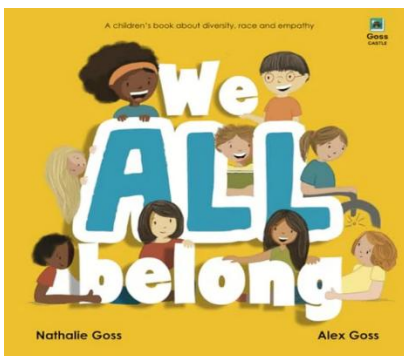
When worries crop up across the day it can be hard to help your child manage them. A way to help this is to set a dedicated time to talk about them.

- Pick a regular 10-to-15-minute window each day
- During the day, if a worry pops up, your child can "postpone" it by writing it down or drawing it on a slip of paper and putting it in a jar.
- When Worry Time arrives, look at the slips together, talk them through, and come up with solutions.
- When the timer goes off, Worry Time is finished, and the slips are folded away. This teaches children that they can acknowledge their thoughts without letting them take over the whole day.

If you notice that a worry is starting to get in the way of your child's sleeping, eating or general wellbeing, please speak with your child's class teacher.

### Diversity and Equality

#### We all belong



This week, the whole school explored the book *We ALL Belong* by Nathalie and Alex Goss, which teaches that everyone is unique, everyone matters and our differences make our school stronger.

In Monday's assembly, we discussed what it means to belong, using the Artemis II space crew as an example. The children agreed that a mission is more successful when crew members bring a diverse mix of skills and backgrounds. They also noted that despite their differences, the astronauts found so much in common, developing deep mutual respect and friendship. This is a vital lesson for our community as understanding each other's joys, challenges and traditions is how we learn to truly care for one another. To put this into practice, the children were set a four-part challenge this week:

- Learn one new thing about someone else.
- Include someone who is on their own.
- Celebrate what makes you unique.
- Help someone else feel that they belong.



I wonder how many achieved it - and perhaps it's a challenge we as adults could take on, too? We look forward to sharing the children's learning activities with you next week.
