School Meals Update: Keep an Eye on Your Inbox!

Following up on our exciting news about our new school caterer, **Dolce Ltd**, and the **SchoolGrid** portal launching this September, we wanted to give you a quick heads-up to look out for further information.

As mentioned, you don't need to take any action just yet. However, behind the scenes, we are preparing to share the priority 1 contact email addresses with SchoolGrid so your accounts can be created.

What to look out for next:

- **School Office:** will be sending an email containing a Welcome letter from Dolce along with detailed instructions to setting up your school grid account. All parents must activate a school grid account to enable your child to receive a school dinner from 1st September 26.
- **The Activation Email:** coming next week, priority 1 parents/carers will receive an email directly from **SchoolGrid** containing your unique activation link and step-by-step instructions.
- **Action Required:** please ensure you look out for this email and complete the setup within 24 hours of receiving the link otherwise it will expire, after the account is activated a second parent/carer can be added. Once the account set up is complete you will be able to pre-order meals, manage payments, and log crucial allergen information.

If you have any urgent questions in the meantime, please feel free to contact the school office.

New Photographic Images and Name of Children – Consent Form

Earlier this week we sent an email saying "Following a review of our 'Photographic Images and Names of Children - Consent Form', we are introducing a whole new form. From September 2026, we will disregard all current parental consent and use the new consent form. Please use the link below to complete the form.

Walton Oak Nursery – places available for 2025-26 and beyond!

We are incredibly proud of the Nursery provision at Walton oak, rated as Good as part of our most recent school Ofsted. Reminder: Year 6 Festival – Wednesday 15th July

At 2.00pm on Wednesday 15th July, the parents/carers of children in Year 6 are invited to be part of the children's colour run (an obstacle course style fun run with a sprinkling of colour). The children will need to bring a white t-shirt to change into (or they can wear this all day if they would like), as well as ensuring they are in appropriate shoes and clothing for the colour run (perhaps not their best trainers). Parents/carers will be able to take photographs of the children and support with the colour run so that they are part of this special celebration.

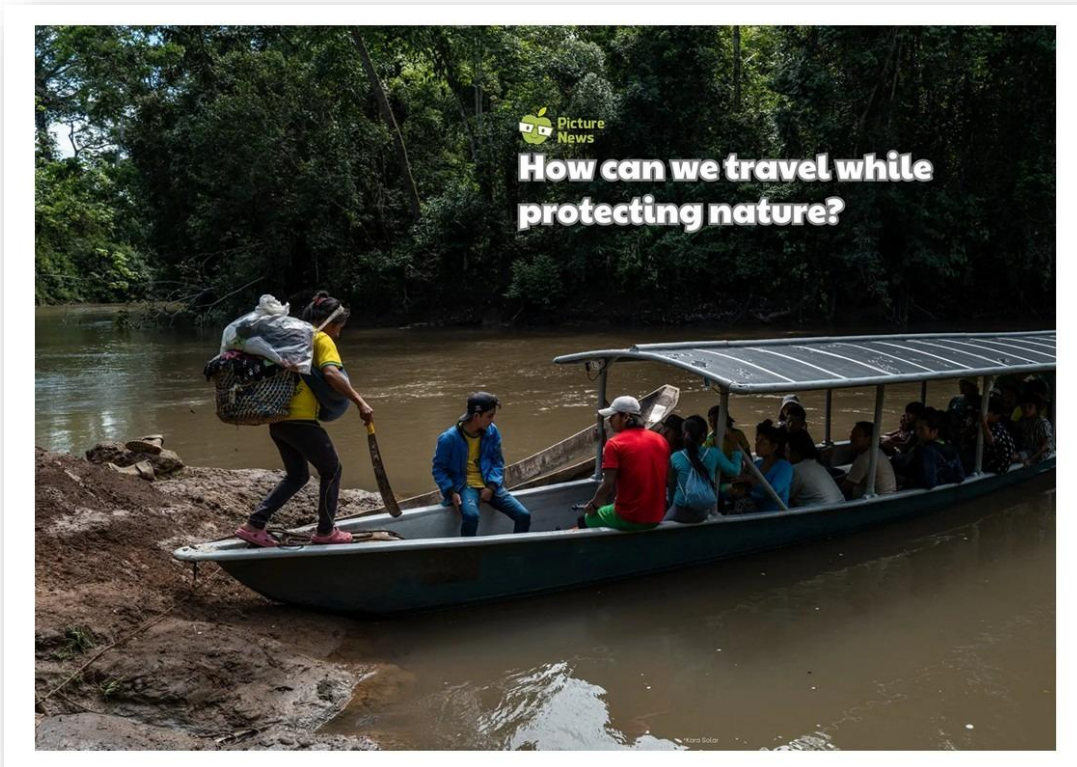

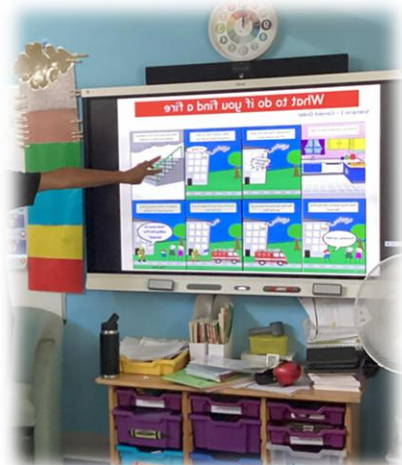


Enrichment Activities

Diversity and Equality

Growing Together Through Respect



At Walton Oak we are committed to creating a community where everyone feels safe, valued and respected.



We are continually finding ways to broaden our children's understanding of the diverse world we live in and to celebrate the different cultures, languages, beliefs and experiences within our own school and local community. This diversity adds richness, interest and strength to our school, making it a better place for everyone.

As children are introduced to people, traditions and experiences that may be different from their own, some naturally find these differences difficult to understand and, at times, may even feel uncomfortable. This is a normal part of learning and growing. Our role is to help children ask questions, express their thoughts and respond to differences with curiosity, kindness and respect.

This week we have reminded our children that copying or mocking someone's accent, making fun of music from another culture, or imitating aspects of someone's culture in a disrespectful way is never appropriate. Sometimes children do these things without meaning to upset anyone, but that does not stop them from causing hurt. Actions can still be racist, even when no offence was intended.

It is also important for children to understand that you do not have to be from the culture being mocked to feel sad, uncomfortable or offended. When we laugh at or make fun of someone's identity or culture, it affects everyone around us and goes against the values we are working so hard to build.

We would be grateful for your support in reinforcing these messages at home. Talking positively about different cultures, encouraging children to ask respectful questions, challenging stereotypes if they arise and reminding children to think about how their words and actions might make others feel can all make a significant difference. By working together, we can help our children grow into respectful, compassionate young people who value difference and help create a community where everyone feels they belong.



Pastoral News

Young Carers



A Young Carer is anyone who might need to provide additional support to a parent or sibling who has an illness or disability. This might be:

- Providing emotional support or keeping an eye on a family member to make sure they are okay.
- Helping a sibling or parent get dressed, move around, or take their medication.
- Taking on extra household chores like cooking, cleaning, or doing the shopping.
- Translating or interpreting for a parent at appointments.

At Walton Oak we have a Young Carers group run by Mrs Herron-Duke and Miss Williams where the children have the opportunity to take part in activities, share or talk about their experiences if they want to or just have some time dedicated just for them to enjoy the group.

The children can also be registered as a Surrey young carer who are able to provide some additional support. The Young Carers support is currently available for year 1 and above but if your child is in Reception, please let us know that they are a young carer so they can get the support in year 1.

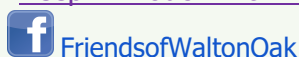
Kids leaving Walton Oak to go to Secondary School? Donate to us!!
