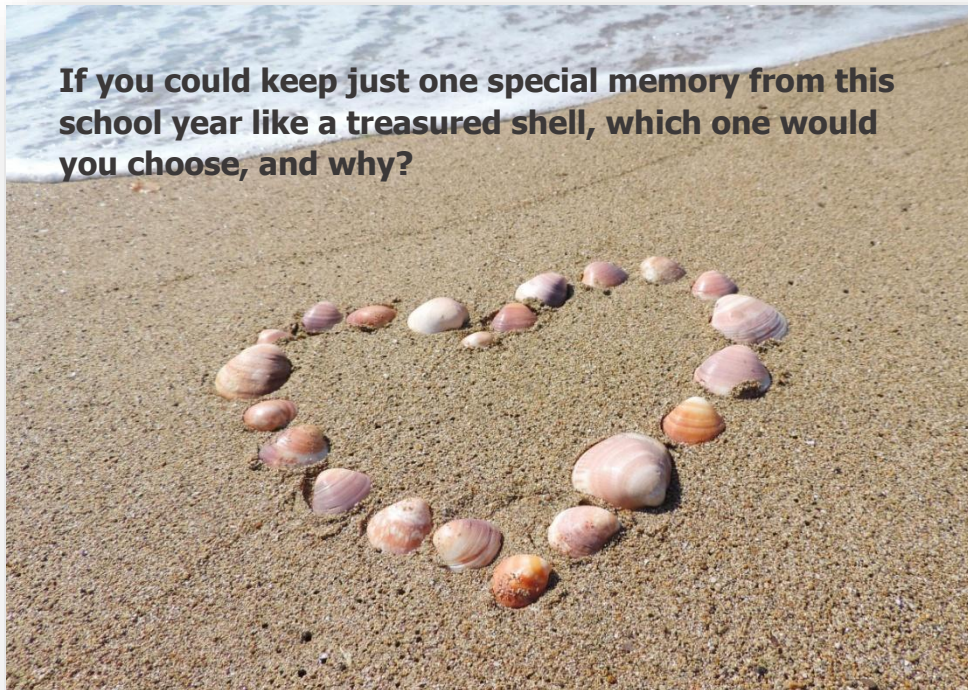

Ancient Greek Workshop

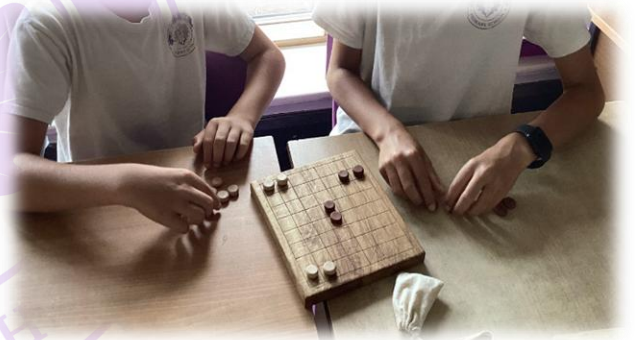
