Dear parents and carers,

This letter outlines key information regarding the End of KS2 Assessments.

### **SATs Preparation**

The children in Year 6 have been working particularly hard in recent weeks as we approach the End of KS2 Assessments. Next week, they will be sitting their final 'mock SATs week' where they will have the opportunity to sit the papers in the rooms that they will sit them in during the official SATs week, as well as with the adults they will be with.

The children are already familiar with the mock process as they completed two mock weeks before the Easter holidays. We are incredibly proud of the effort the children have been putting in and their resilience across the weeks. Next week's practice papers will provide us with the opportunity to identify any key gaps that we can work on as a class/year group ahead of the official SATs week. It will also allow the children to re-familiarise themselves with the way in which the SATs papers look and 'feel' when sitting them (e.g. the types of questions and the timings).

### **SATs Breakfast**

All of the Year 6 children are invited to join us for a Year 6 breakfast on the mornings of their SATs from **8.10am**. The children will use the main entrance by the office to come in and will go straight to the hall to be registered and enjoy some toast, fruit and juice. In previous years, this has proved very successful in settling the children before they sit their assessments and allowing them to spend quality time with their peers. On **Friday 6<sup>th</sup> May** we will be running a 'rehearsal' breakfast to allow the children to get a feel for how this will be during the official week. On this day, the children can arrive to school at 8.10am for their breakfast, as they would during the following week (Mon-Thurs).
