Headteacher's Message

It has been wonderful to welcome back many of our Walton Oak families this week, with children in Nursery and years 1-6 returning to school in the sunshine. I have particularly enjoyed hearing about all the adventures the children had with their families during the holidays. A lot can happen during the six week break and we are acutely aware of the fact that not everyone will have had the same experiences. However, we hope that the children's first week back with their new teachers and friends has been a positive one. The school has certainly felt incredibly calm and settled and we are very proud of how quickly the children have adapted to their new class routines.

Our staff returned to school last Friday 1st September for our in-service training (inset) days. With several new members of staff joining our team, we spent time our first day getting to know each other and considering how important it is to feel a sense of belonging. Knowing that you are accepted and valued for who you are creates a feeling of safety which is an essential ingredient for wellbeing and achievement. We reflected on how well we prepare the learning opportunities and environment at Walton oak to ensure children feel as though they belong. Consistent routines and positive relationships are an important aspect of this, supported by the values that form our Walton Oak Way.

Other areas that remain a focus are: reading, as we saw such a positive impact from our provision last year and wish for that to continue; and ensuring that learning across the curriculum really 'sticks' so children can refer back to previous learning when making new connections. We have lots of plans already in place regarding both of these areas and are really excited about the year ahead.

I hope you like our new look newsletter. We have been considering how to ensure that it contains a good balance of celebration and information as well as being easy to navigate. The buttons at the side are 'live' links to our webpage – see below for more information.

Finally I'd like to welcome our new Reception parents who are receiving the Walton Oak Wire for the first time, in advance of their children joining us next week. It is the start of an exciting new journey for you and your children, as they embark on their seven year journey into primary school. I look forward to getting to know you all over the coming weeks.

General Information and Reminders

The new layout of the Walton Oak Wire is designed to help you navigate to the information you need most, a lot more easily. There will be regular sections each week that give information about events that have taken place in school, provide helpful information and celebrate the children's achievements. You will notice that there is no longer a date's page at the bottom of this letter. This is because the buttons to the side of the front page are live links to our school website. The online calendar is regularly updated and contains all the latest dates for your diaries. This page can be viewed as a chart or a list by selecting either the 'calendar' or 'month' view. It can also be printed for fridges and noticeboards. You can view the online calendar with a simple click, along with the other information about FOWO, school meals, term dates, the pastoral team, uniform, online forms and jobs in the Trust. Please explore and let us know if you experience any problems with finding the information you require so that we can support you in navigating your way around.

Zebra Crossing

It has been a long time in the planning and finally we have a zebra crossing outside our school, as well as additional road markings that open up the visibility for pedestrians and traffic, making it a safer place for children to cross. Thank you to the parents who have campaigned tirelessly for this development to take





place. There may be some refinement works happening in the coming weeks that could cause further closure. We will endeavour to manage this with our crossing patrol officer. Thank you to Mr Godinho for his willingness to carry out this role (despite it not being in his original job description) so cheerfully over the past two years. He has been a popular feature for the children each morning and will be missed on the crossing. Don't worry though, he will still be on the gate each day to keep an eye on the road and provide a welcoming smile.

EYFS Outdoor Area

I expect many of you have noticed our newly extended and renovated Early Years area where our Nursery and Reception children will enjoy playing, learning and developing a wide range of skills. We are so very grateful to our wonderful parents who, through your contributions to FOWO events and activities, helped us to purchase the interactive water wall in Nursery and the interactive stream in the Reception area. Both spaces open up a wealth of opportunities for the children as they can control the pumping of the water, enjoy the sensation that the flowing water brings and create water journeys through floating objects and making damns.

Each play area also has a climbing stack, mud kitchen, bug hotel, creative play area, mark making area and many other resources that bring creativity and interest to the children's day. We are already planning ways to further enhance the environments once we have had the opportunity to watch the children at play and identify their interests within the new spaces. New Awards

In addition to our very special gold leaves and house competition prizes, we are introducing two other awards that children will be able to strive to achieve on a half termly and termly basis:

<u>WOW Values Award</u>: Each half term, teachers will be looking out for the children who are consistently demonstrating our Walton Oak Way and striving to live our school motto of Being Our Best. The award will be linked to the theme of our assemblies each half term and the associated values. Our WOW values are: We are ambitious; We are Collaborative; We are Courageous; We are Curious; We are Inclusive; We are Kind; We are Resilient; We are Respectful. Children learn about these values and what it means to live by them and demonstrate them in work and play. Two children each half term will receive the award from each class. Headteacher Award: This is a very special award and one that only some children will receive during their time at Walton Oak. It is for the children who show tremendous effort to be their best, whether it be because they consistently demonstrate WOW values and effort in everything they do, or because they have overcome barriers and made progress in their academic, social or emotional development. One child in each class will be awarded this certificate each term.

Introducing Miss Williams, our new Emotional, Literacy Support Assistant (ELSA)

Many of our families will know me from when I joined the Early Years team as a Teaching assistant in September 2015. In 2020 I trained as a licenced Thrive practitioner which is a developmental and traumasensitive approach to meeting the social and emotional needs of children. After completing my training, I worked closely with the HSLW, Pastoral Co-ordinator and Nurture lead offering 1:1 and small group sessions to children across the school from Early years to Year 6. In July 2023 I was appointed to the ELSA (Emotional Literacy support assistant) position at Walton Oak. This year I am looking forward to working closely with Natasha, our HSLW supporting children and Families by offering 1:1, small group sessions with the children, embedding the Young Carers initiative across the school and running parent coffee mornings as well as being a friendly face at the School gate.

My name is Natasha Herron-Duke and I am new to role at Walton Oak as the Home School Link Worker (HSLW). Class list – Nursery, Reception and Year 1 parents

If you are on Classlist, please can you check that your child(ren) are in the correct year group? So, Nursery 23-24, Reception 23 – 24, Year One 23- 24. Their classes will not have automatically updated from last year, as we don't know if your child moved up from nursery or which year one classes they were allocated to. The old 2022-23 classes will no longer be used, and you won't receive any notifications if in these year groups. To update the class:

- Log into the app
- Click on your profile picture (bottom right)
- · Click children and classes
- Click edit next to the child's name
- Click child's class
- Select the class they are in this year.

All other year groups and classes were renamed, so your child(ren) should have moved automatically.
