Reading

Reading Awards

Reading at home with your children helps them to strengthen their language, vocabulary, and comprehension skills. There is an expectation that you are hearing your child read at home at least 3 times a week. Every time your child reads with an adult, that 'read' is recorded (up to a maximum of 10 a week) and a visual representation of this is displayed in the classroom. The children then receive awards for reaching different points on the display. These are:

20 reads - sticker

50 reads – bookmark

100 reads - certificate

150 reads - pencil

200 reads - badge

300 reads - medal

Make sure your child records all their reads in order to achieve a prize this year.

Enrichment Activities

Year 3 Butser Ancient Farm Trip

On Monday, Year 3 went to Butster Ancient Farm to discover how we lived during the time period of the Stone Age to the Iron Age. The weather was very kind to us and we built wattling fences and made bronze jewellery in the sunshine. We sat around a fire in an Iron Age house and passed around artefacts from the ages including the skin of a fox, a goats skull, a harpoon and flint that was used to create a spear head. The children also brought home their cordage creations of weaved straw.







Year 4 River Trip



On Tuesday, Year 4 went on a walk to the River Thames. As part of their Geography learning this term, they are considering the question: How is Walton influenced by the presence of the Thames? On the trip, they looked at the wildlife, buildings lining the banks and the reasons that the river was being used for leisure activities. They gathered this information from their walk along the towpath and from a boat. The boat



took the children on a round trip from Walton Bridge past Desborough Island and through Shepperton Lock.

Writing workshop



When we arrived at Cardinal Newman School, we were welcomed into the hall to wait for everyone. When everyone had arrived, the author came (Robin Price) to greet us. He told us what our first activity was. We had to get into partners to write a story based on Greek Mythology. Then, we had to stand up and read it in front of everybody using a microphone (this was scary). We then changed partners so we could do another story, in this one we wrote about fairy-tale creatures.
