

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
## Y6 LLT TTRS Battle Results

## The Bridge

This week we would like to make our families aware of the amazing work Walton and Hersham charities provide called the bridge.

The Bridge is a new community space in central Walton offering practical support for families in Elmbridge who are struggling with the rising cost of living.

Based on Bridge Street, The Bridge is a friendly space run for the community by the community. It's open to local parents and families to access food, specialist support and friendly advice. There are informal meeting spaces upstairs for local charities to run workshops, advice sessions or just bring people together for a coffee and chat in the warmth. Downstairs, there is a new community shop-without-a-till, offering families who are referred to The Bridge a chance to pick-up food and household supplies at no cost. By bringing down weekly shopping bills, families will have more money for other essentials like utility bills and school uniforms.

"I can't afford it all by myself".

My wages aren't stretching as far and we're starting to get into arrears. The government are putting a lot out there but I'm not eligible for it. It's very hard.

#### Calling All Tesco Shoppers




