






Staff News

Parental Engagement Survey - Summary of Findings

This term, we sent out a survey to parents regarding parental engagement in school. Thank you to the parents and carers who took the time to complete this survey. The information that the survey has provided has been very useful, allowing us - as a school - to reflect on what we currently do to engage parents and carers in school as well as what we can do differently. Largely, the survey has shown that work commitments are the biggest barrier to parents/carers being unable to attend events in school. The majority of parents who completed the survey would be happy to engage in virtual workshops which is something we will certainly be looking at going forward. We are keen to make sure that the virtual world does not take away from parents/carers having the opportunity to physically come into school so we will be carefully planning which workshops and information sessions are best



delivered virtually and which events are best attended in person. Many parents/carers are keen to have wider opportunities to come into school and engage in their child's learning alongside their child; this is something that takes place in EYFS and Year 1 and has proved very successful. We are now looking at ways that we can replicate this experience from Year 2 upwards. Look out for further information regarding parent/carer workshops and events in the new year!

Christmas is supposed to be the most wonderful time of the year but for lots of young children with autism it can be stressful. Whether they are excited or overwhelmed, here are some top tips to help the stress of Christmas:

Sensory Needs

Christmas is sparkly and noisy. It can be chaotic and cold. There's lots of colour and glitter everywhere and people showing up in brightly coloured Christmas jumpers. There can be unusual smells, like pine trees or candles. Some helpful hints to help your child's sensory overload could be:

- > Take the banger out of the crackers at home
- > Avoid scented candles that can make your house smell different
- > Try to set the Christmas lights to always on rather than flashing

Share the plan

With all the excitement of Christmas day, it's important to remember that what your child really wants to know is what the plan is for the day. Remember you could try using a now/next board or some children benefit from having choices. You could even try leaving some parts of the day blank, offering them a small number of options to choose from.

Flexibility

Remember to be prepared to be flexible, Christmas can be stressful and busy. Give thought that sometimes our young people just won't be able to do what we had planned, so try to have some appropriate options available as back up plans. Prioritise which battles that you are willing to stand your ground on.

After Christmas

Just as we prepare for Christmas and all the changes it brings it is beneficial to give as much thought to how we prepare for the changes back to 'normal' again. Try using a calendar to mark out important dates for example, when you are taking the Christmas decorations down and school return dates.

Fun!

Lastly, remember to have fun! Christmas can be stressful but it's also meant to be fun. Try to go with the flow and enjoy all of the special qualities that a child with autism brings!
