Headteacher's Message

It has been a very focused week at Walton Oak. I have felt so proud of the attitudes towards learning that children across the school have shown in their lessons. I particularly enjoyed spending time in Year 5, to join in their special PSHE learning about friendships and how they manage their emotions and responses towards each other. The children showed maturity in how they discussed their thoughts and shared their suggestions. I feel positive about how they will be able to apply this new learning to their everyday lives.



An exciting moment for all, but especially our youngest children, was when we had some snowfall earlier in the week. Although just a sprinkling, it caused such wonder for our reception and nursery children as many had not remembered seeing snow before. It was delightful to see them chasing the snowflakes and catching them to look more closely - some tried to catch them on their tongues. How wonderful the world can be through fresh eyes!

We had our last set of parent tours this week, for our new 2024 reception cohort. The deadline for applications is on Monday and we are hopeful that we will be a popular school choice for our local families. Our Pupil Leadership Team have enjoyed taking part in these, with Lisa and Bilal (our Head and Deputy pupils) giving insightful speeches and the whole PLT leading parents around the school and answering their questions. We are very proud of them for being excellent role models.

This term will see our Pupil Leaders and Senior Prefects carrying out some exciting projects around pupil wellbeing, anti-bullying and community links. There will be various meetings next week to seek the children's views and allocate roles for them to carry out. I look forward to sharing plans with you in due course.

Finally, it has felt positive to have sent emails of recognition to the parents/carers of 97 of our children to congratulate them for their child's 100% attendance during the first term of this year. Our attendance leaflet, that we shared last week, highlights how attendance over 95% is good and over 98% is excellent. 100% equates to not a single days absence – well done to all those who managed to achieve this.


In the news this week

What Does FOWO do? FOWO committee profiles

Over this term, we will be providing short profiles of FOWO committee members in the Wire. Often, people ask what being on the committee involves; this should provide some more insight! This week, Helen Allingham, Chair of FOWO, writes about what she does.



I'm Helen, mum to Magnus in Year 5 and Charlie in Year 2. I work as a business researcher and writer and am also the current Chair of FOWO. I've been on the FOWO Committee since 2019 and Chair since September 2022. My role is to lead the FOWO committee and make sure we achieve the goals of the PTA, which we agree with the school leadership. Often, the role of a PTA is to raise additional funds for a school; here at Walton Oak, we do fundraise through FOWO, as with the Bag2School initiative, but more importantly, our role is to help build a sense of community among our school families. We do this by organising community events, such as the Christmas and Summer Fairs and the Parents' Quiz Night. In my role, I chair the open termly meetings where we discuss the planned events and what needs to be done to make them happen. We try to spread the load between us as a committee, with different members leading the various activities. This year, I am leading the new gardening events and the summer fair.

I've really enjoyed being on the FOWO Committee, it's great to be able to contribute to our school. and to get to know people from other year groups. I'd encourage everyone to get involved with FOWO in some capacity if they can. It's open to all school parents/carers and no special experience is required. - Understanding, expressing and managing emotions




