Islam - What is important for Muslim families? In what way is the Mosque special for Muslims?

- The word 'Islam' means 'peace' in Arabic and the word 'respect' is important to Muslims
- Muslims believe that Muhammad (pbuh*): is a prophet and the last messenger of Allah in Isla is the best example of a Muslim, and that they should try to be like him
- The Qur'an: is the special book for Muslims and is written in Arabic contains the holy words of Allah to Muhammad

MATHS Place Value (Within 20)

- Count to and across 100, forwards and backwards, beginning with zero or 1, or from any given number
- Identify and represent numbers using objects and pictorial representations including the number line, and use the language of: equal to, more than, less than (fewer), most, least
- Count, read and write numbers to 100 in numerals; count in multiples of 2s, 5s and 10s
- Read and write numbers from 1 to 20 in numerals and words
- Given a number, identify 1 more and 1 less

Addition and Subtraction (Within 20)

- Read, write and interpret mathematical statements involving addition (+), subtraction (–) and equals (=) signs
- Add and subtract 1-digit and 2-digit numbers to 20, including zero
- Represent and use number bonds and related subtraction facts within 20
- Add and subtract 1-digit and 2-digit numbers to 20, including zero
- Solve one-step problems that involve addition and subtraction, using concrete objects and pictorial representations, and missing number problems such as 7 = ? – 9
