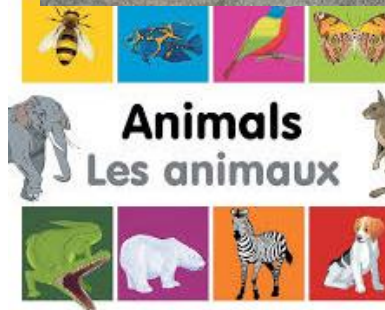
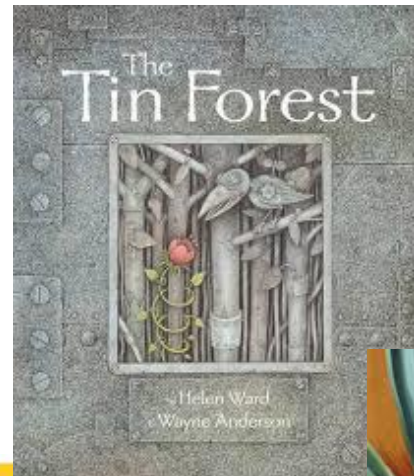
- To understand fractions on a number line.

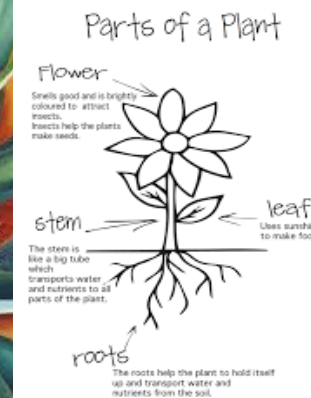
