It was lovely to mark this with a special assembly this morning where a number of children proudly received various awards; we celebrated the achievement of many house points; and the children sang the songs they have been learning this term. It was certainly an uplifting start to the last day of term. I think everyone is ready for the Easter break now to rest and recoup, ready for an eventful Summer Term.

Last night we held our Local Governor Body meeting for the Spring Term. As always, it was fully attended and there was a lot of discussion about how well the school is achieving its priorities. Across the term, the Governors carried out a range of visits to support the evaluation of the school. There was a focus on the quality of education, particularly looking at the support teachers receive to be able meet the needs of all the children in their class and ensure that all children can learn well. There was also a focus on behaviour, both inside the school and at playtimes. The general feedback was positive. Governors used their insight to validate that leaders are taking the right actions to keep children safe and ensure children are receiving the education they deserve. They asked probing questions to encourage me, as Headteacher, to think deeply about what is important for us, right now as a school and what requires further consideration going forwards. Ensuring children attend well is definitely an area to continue to focus on. We are also going to look closely at the developments in the foundation subjects (the wider curriculum beyond Maths and English) to make sure children are receiving broad and balanced opportunities across a range of subjects. I am grateful for this support from our Governing body.

I wish you all a positive Easter Break. I hope you manage to enjoy quality time together and that the weather is kind enough to us, so the children can get outside and have some fun. I look forward to welcoming everyone back to Walton Oak on Monday 15th April.



Year 3 Ancient Egypt



We are now pleased to share that, as a result of all of the house points earnt from this competition, the results are as follows:




